Here we share some of our favorite articles that were published in this issue of the journal. In this issue, Spiliotis et al. discussed the possible differences in survival between residual and recurrent disease in patients with ovarian cancer presenting with disease relapse. Besides, Rabiepour et al. determined the relationship between maternal stress during pregnancy and cortisol plus maternal serum leptin concentrations as well as pregnancy outcomes. Mammalian target of rapamycin (mTOR) is a serine/threonine protein kinase and is part of the phosphatidyl

inositole-3-kinase (PI3K)/AKT signal pathway. It plays a critical role in cellular development, metabolism, and the cell cycle of cancer cells. Güralp et al. investigated the role of mTOR in human granulosa cell ovarian tumors and the therapeutic effect of rapamycin in COV434 mitotic granulosa cell lines.
