We are very pleased that laparoscopic treatment has become established. On the other hand, the absence of an ipsilateral fallopian tube makes the case interesting. The authors also performed a hysteroscopy before the operation. In the differential diagnosis of interstitial pregnancy, the use of hysteroscopy is a useful method in difficult cases. We expect that the use of minimally invasive methods will increase as knowledge on this topic increases.
